Scare fresh water sources
Man made

Unscientific shrimp farming & salt water entry
Poor management of land & water resources
Pollution

Negative attitude in solving public issue

### Intervention points identified

 Agricultural practices-(Vegetables, paddy, medicinal plants, etc) Aquaculture system-(prawn-paddy) Fishing practices Land use (canal encroachments, constructions, etc.) Waste management Alternate livelihood options

#### Intervention modes

#### Nature camps

- Interactive sessions for responsible fisheries techniques
- Awareness classes & discussion with local authorities

#### Focus group interactions

- Ward level (12 nos) interactive workshops with villagers
- Demonstration of demonstration of waste management methods
- Trainings for alternate livelihood option
