Background

- Fisheries as a human economic activity are subject to change. Fish markets are changing due to consumptions patterns affecting catch volumes and this is also changing organizational structures in fisheries communities.
- Fishing is a way of life, dependent on fish resources, therefore, the scarcity or abundance of fish resources can influence how coastal communities organize and it can also influence gender dynamics.

- Women's participation in fisheries was also affected and some traditional roles sucha as Gabioteras also change




Research objective
